I know you are beginning to think about the Holiday season but I wanted to give you an update on TCHVA membership and encourage you to reach out to any and all of the shipmates. In September, we sent out an email with membership status and encouraged everyone whose membership is expired/expiring to join/renew TCHVA. A handful of shipmates responded but the majority did not.

As of today, we have 27 current members whose membership expires at year end. Today, our membership stands at 104 so that means if the 27 don't renew, we will be losing over 25% of

our membership. The other 300 or so names on the listing from the September email have not responded either. Frankly, I'm a bit saddened by these numbers, particularly when the ship's Facebook page seems to have a lot of shipmates who visit there regularly and are excited about the TCH. REUNION 2016

The planning for the 2015 T.C. Hart Reunion started at last summer's reunion in Louisville KY. The membership in attendance narrowed the options for the next reunion to 3 locations: Norfolk VA, Newport RI and Minneapolis MN. There will be an on line vote by the membership in early 2014 to determine where the reunion will be held. In the meantime, here are some details on each of the cities in the running:

MINNEAPOLIS

Here are my reasons as to why I think the reunion should be held in Minneapolis. If Minneapolis is selected I have volunteered to be the planner for the reunion.

The cities of Minneapolis and St Paul and their suburbs are collectively known as the twin Cities Metro area. It is the 16th largest metropolitan area in the country with a total population of over 3.3 million. In spite of its frigid winters (or maybe because of them) there are a multitude of things to do. It is the home of the Major League football "Vikings", baseball, "Twins" Basketball "Timberwolves", and Hockey "Wild," and the National Champion Lynx Women's basketball team. There are numerous theaters, comedy clubs, and museums. It is the home of Mall of America, the country's largest shopping mall.

The biggest selling point for having the reunion in Minnesota is the Mall of America. You could spend several days there and not run out of new things to do. It is located in Bloomington MN about 12 miles from Minneapolis and 1 mile from the airport. The mall has over 520 shops and stores, an amusement park with roller coasters and other thrill and nonthrill rides. There are over 50 restaurants ranging from fast food to fancy gourmet. You could putt-putt golf, go through the aquarium or see a movie in one of the 16 screens at the movie theater. There is a bowling alley, a wedding chapel and a comedy club along with several bars. Since Minnesota does not have a sales tax on clothing it is a great place to shop for clothing. I hate shopping, but I still go to the mall regularly to walk and people watch. The mall is the number one tourist attraction in the country based on the number of people who go through the doors each year. There are many charter flights from various cities from the US and around the world that were set up just to bring people to the Mall of America.

The Twin Cities are also known for their outdoor recreation. Minneapolis means "The City of lakes" and there are lakes, ponds, rivers and streams throughout the area. There are numerous city and county parks and nature areas. There is also a MN State Park and a National Wildlife area within minutes of the Mall of America. Outdoor recreation activities include swimming, sightseeing, bird and wildlife watching, hiking, biking, boating, canoeing and fishing among others. Despite the cold wintertime climate, Minneapolis has a thriving bike community. It has 120 miles of on- and off-street bicycle facilities, plus indoor bike parking and other cycling-friendly facilities. It was designated by Bicycling Magazine as the number 1 bike friendly city in the US in 2012. You can rent a bike and travel either paved or unpaved trails.

The T.C. Hart has a connection to Minnesota. On July 4th 1976 Hubert H Humphrey the former Mayor of Minneapolis, US senator representing Minnesota and US Vice President under Lyndon Johnson, gave a speech at a party that was being hosted by the Hart in Stavanger Norway. Two days later he took a tour of the ship. I had the privilege of shaking his hand when the only other sailor on the ship from Minnesota and I were introduced to him. Other famous people who are from Minnesota... former Vice President Walter Mondale, Current senator and past Saturday Night live writer and comedian Al Franken and Congresswoman Michelle Bachman, (shows that Minnesota takes its politics seriously) Singers Bob Dylan and Prince. Comedians Garrison Keilor and Lonny Anderson, and movie producers the Coen brothers.

If Minneapolis is selected, I plan to choose a hotel that is either attached to the Mall or is just across the street. I will also look for some cheap hotels options that are in the area. Most Bloomington hotels give free shuttle service to the mall and airport. For tours I am thinking of a city tour of Minneapolis and St Paul, a dinner cruise either on Lake Minnetonka or on the Mississippi, St Croix or the Minnesota River. We could also go to one of several good dinner theaters in the area. There is also a historic cave tour in St Paul, a Brew Pup tour of Minneapolis or a winery tour just outside of the south metro. Other options are tickets to see a Minnesota Twins game at Target Field the newest major league baseball park in the country, or maybe to see a Minnesota Lynx women's professional basketball game. Since the Mall is located on a light rail line you can get to or from the airport and to downtown Minneapolis where the Twins, Lynx, and timber wolves play their home games. It also has a stop at the Minneapolis VA Medical Center. I will try to plan some of the tours to use the light rail instead of renting a bus. I am also considering some cheap or no cost options such as a daily morning hike on one of the several nearby hiking trails in the area. I have some other ideas and am open to suggestions and feedback. I have include some links below if you are interested in seeing more

NORFOLK, VA

But it's time to start planning for the next one and I thought I would give you some insight on one of the location that will be up for consideration when we select the site...Norfolk VA.

Yes we have all been there once or twice before, but if you haven't been there in a while you will be surprised. Norfolk provides many opportunities for things to do and see and places to visit within driving distance. If you like to just hang out on the beach there is that, or catch a boat for some deep sea fishing. There are also numerous places to eat everything from pizza and pasta, to sea food and sushi, or grab a burger or a slice of prime rib. If you want a more interesting way to dine there is always the Spirit of Norfolk Dinner cruise which has always been a popular attraction. If you are looking for something a little more entertaining the Mystery dinner Theater is a great place to go.

The tour possibilities are almost endless. There are all the military bases, Norfolk Navel Base, NAS Oceana, Fort Wool, and Fort Eustis just to name a couple. There are wineries with in driving distance where you can take tours and tasted some great Virginia wines. Colonial Williamsburg and York Town are about an hour away if you want to take in some history, as well as the War Birds Museum in Pungo where you can view vintage military aircraft, and if the timing is right, possibly see some of the old bird in the air. Or for a cooler treat go by Dumars Ice cream shop for a taste of good old fashioned ice cream in one of the waffle cones made from the original machine made for a World's Fair.

And if you want to shop...way too much to mention. Beach shops, malls, and specialty shops are everywhere.

Whether you decide to fly, drive, or take the train to get there, Norfolk is a great place to have the reunion and visit with old friends and bring back some old memories. The choice of location is up to you the membership what ever you decide I can assure you, you will have a great time.

NEWPORT, RI

Walk along the Cliff Walk in Newport, RI and see the gorgeous mansions that served as summer homes for the rich and famous of a century ago. Many of the mansions are open to the public. If mansions aren't your style, there's downtown Newport and Thames Street. See the harbor where the America's Cup sailing races were held for many years. Take a harbor cruise, or even a day trip to Block Island. Perhaps you'd be interested in Rose Island Lighthouse, Touro Synagogue (the oldest synagogue in the US), the International Tennis Hall of Fame, or perhaps visit the US Naval War College. About 30 minutes away in Falls River, MA is Battleship Cove, with the USS Massachusetts, the destroyer USS Joseph P. Kennedy, submarine USS Lionfish, and two PT boats, plus the National Destroyerman's Museum.

Although Newport can be a bit pricey, by judicious timing or staying just a few miles away, costs can be quite reasonable.
